- Must live in Franklin County, have no health insurance or prescription coverage or your medical costs are greater than 5% of your income

- You have to make less than \$1,915 per month for one person, \$2,585 for two people or add \$670 more for each extra family member

Bring with you:

- Proof that you live in Franklin County like an ID, lease, or utility bill
- Proof of your income like a pay stub or tax return
- Your medical expenses like doctor bills and prescription co-pays
- Your original prescriptions and/or pill bottles
